The modern, imposing building offers many architectural delights, a work of art. An inviting roof top garden deck, overlooking Shoal Creek and Lady Bird Lake, makes perfect space to hang out, read, study and marvel at the gorgeous view. Inside, natural lighting, spacious areas, reading porches and comfy, comfortable furniture brightens one's spirit.

By the numbers: 589 seats, 140 public use PC & Mac computers, one clever gift shop, 6 floors and 14 shared "learning rooms" (designed for classes, workshops, meetings and & co-working).
