

# Have You Been to Celeb Salon? Take a Look at What Our Volunteer Has to Say

At Capital City Village, we love to discover the skills that each of our volunteers has, and then put those skills to work. Well, one of our newer volunteers is Megan, who is a senior editor for a magazine that you would all recognize. She has agreed to periodically write articles for us. Here's her first one, written about our program Celeb Salons. Enjoy!

"Capital City Village continued its new Celeb Salon series on May 20 with the University of Texas' Dr. Art Markman and KUT's Rebecca McInroy, executive producer of "Two Guys on Your Head," a show that explores how our brains work. Dr. Markman started the event by addressing some of the central

concerns that bring members to Capital City Village—staying social as we age. "Why is important to stay social?" he asked. "Because being social forms new connections in your brain. Our brains have physical mechanisms to engage with each other socially." When we don't use those social connections, he said, our brains suffer.

Markman and McInroy also talked about how our perception of time changes as we age, including the "memory landscapes" that are formed when we get out and encounter new experiences. They answered questions about pain, memory, and whether or not you're getting enough sleep (If you read a book at 3 p.m. and you're asleep at 3:05 p.m., said Markman, you're not getting enough sleep.) Tune into KUT to hear Markman in conversation with Dr. Bob Duke, or subscribe to the Two Guys on Your Head podcast.

Stephen Ennis, the director of the Harry Ransom Center, spoke on June 3. The most recent Celeb Salon was last Sunday, July 8 and featured Dr. Jacqueline Angel, a senior researcher and professor of sociology and public policy at the UT LBJ School of Public Affairs and a nationally recognized expert on aging policy. Celeb Salons are held downtown at Mort Subite, one of the first authentic Belgian-style pubs in the United States."
